Urban. With 11.7 million residents, Ohio is the seventh most populous state in the nation. More than half of Ohio residents live in 15 of the 88 counties. Ohio has six cities with populations of more than 100,000. Only 12 other states have more cities of this size.

Alignment. Ohio State University Extension has a presence in all Ohio communities and continues to advance engagement with rural, suburban, and urban Ohioans. OSU Extension in the City strategically aligns with

Engaged Ohioans, Vibrant Communities

Extension is working with the city of Cleveland to help its residents adapt to the changing climate by engaging in climate action planning. By producing a Climate Action Plan (CAP) the city is not only helping local stakeholders mitigate the effects of climate change, but also creating economic, environmental, and socially equitable benefits for all Clevelanders.



Ohio State University Extension, is partnering with urban growers to increase the production of local foods and to create jobs. Columbus (Franklin County) has an estimated 30 urban farms and Cleveland (Cuyahoga County) has 45.





Thriving Across the Lifespan

In Ohio's 15 most populated counties, OSU Extension served more than 48,894 youth through 4-H clubs, camps, school enrichment, agri-science in the city, Metro Parks partnerships, and other innovative programs reaching diverse audiences through community partnerships.

Workforce Development

In Mahoning County (Youngstown area) more than 200 clientele acquired new skills in business management, growth strategies, and asset and risk management to enhance fiscal success and reduce liability risk.

Health and Wellness

During the 2018 fiscal year, Ohio SNAP-ED reached 131,176 adults, teens, and youth with its nutrition and physical activity programs in the 15 most populous counties in Ohio.

Environmental Quality

In Lucas County (Toledo area), 740 farmers and commercial horticultural professionals received training in practices to protect environmental and/or water quality and conserve natural resources.
